



ILYA NAISHULLER

Dubbed the next Quentin Tarantino, Ilya Naishuller is a Russian film director and frontman for the Moscow punk band Biting Elbows. In 2013 he released 'Bad Motherfucker' which doubled up as both music video and branded content for Russian Vodka, Neft. To date, it has amassed over 130 million views. In 2014 Ilya shot his first feature-length film 'Hardcore' starring 'District 9's Sharlto Copley. Since then Naishuller has picked up dozens of major awards for his music videos for Russian band Leningrad including 'Kolshik', 'Voyage', 'Juju' and his latest 'Tsoi', as well as several major awards for his music video for the Weeknd, 'False Alarm', which has amassed over 116 million views online. In 2019 he shot his second movie 'Nobody' by 'John Wick' writer Derek Kolstad, starring, Bob Odenkirk and Christopher Lloyd.
